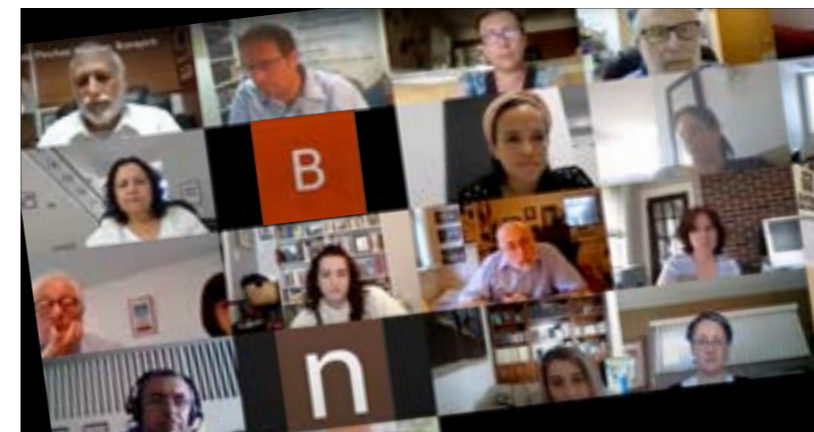

SELF-DEVELOPMENT AND EMPLOYMENT MOTIVATION WORKSHOP

Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT) is a psychological treatment method based on the assumption that problems can be resolved and removed by identifying and changing a person's disruptive thoughts (cognitive change) as well as by identifying and changing his/her patterns of behavior (behavioral change). This enhances personal abilities, and increases the quality of life.

During the workshop we will discuss:

Understanding forms of thinking: Schemes, beliefs, automatic thoughts, and behavioral patterns • Identifying behaviors that cause challenges in the workplace • Change in thinking and behaviors to overcome barriers, improve capabilities, and incorporate coping mechanisms into the world of employment

7.1 THE DIALOGOS MODEL

HARNESS DIALOGUE, DEBATE AND INQUIRY TO ENGAGE STUDENTS TOWARDS ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP

If education is to be “reimagined” in response to COVID-19, it cannot only be via a new focus on integrating technology into the classroom or the integrated home and school learning. Instead, a better reaction to the Coronavirus would be to teach young people about citizenship in both historical, contemporary and visionary ways.

Our real and wonderful challenge is to inspire young people so that they will yearn to acquire the knowledge, skills and understanding that will enable them to imagine and create a better society for all. This is the ideal of citizenship education.

Developed and led by: Professor Baruch Schwarz at the Dialogos Center at the Hebrew University, who combines academic expertise in education through technology, mathematics and science with a deep commitment to Jewish learning, the Jewish people and Israel. He argues that educating for ‘deliberative democracy’ is a crucial educational goal in the 21st century.

MORE ON DIALOGOS:

Professor Schwarz’s approach uses dialogue, debate and inquiry to simultaneously induct young people into a thoughtful system of critical learning while promoting a greater tolerance for the voices and sensibilities of others. This form of education works best in small groups where students practice collaborative learning.

Dialogos has designed a program to train teachers to use this methodology to teach in a broad range of domains and to capitalize on classic and modern Jewish sources in a way that deeply engages students with the sources.

His approach invites profound interaction between young people and our heritage that goes way beyond just learning stories and rituals.

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7.2 THE JEWISH EDUCATOR

[as a Polarity* Navigator]

SPECIAL 3-PART SERIES

Jewish educators often have to navigate between polar positions and find their own place, as well as help students develop their own positions. In this 3-part series, we will examine different examples of such polarities and explore how the very act of exploring them can enrich our own Jewish lives and in turn, those of our students. Jewish sources, historic turning points and contemporary dilemmas will be the backdrop of our discussions.

7.3 STAND-ALONE PRESENTATIONS

I am a Zachor Jew: How about you? We often talk about Jews being ‘Shomer Shabbat’ (Shabbat observant). But what would it mean if we began using Zocher Shabbat as well or instead? After all, the 10 commandments use both terms. This presentation is a celebration of memory and how it can be used by educators to enrich our thinking and work.

The Genius of the Lehrhaus: How to talk intelligently to Jews who do not know much about Judaism 100 years ago, Franz Rosenzweig opened the Lehrhaus (Education Institute) in Germany and ushered in a revolutionary approach to Jewish education. But who remembers his name or contribution? This presentation will introduce Rosenzweig’s amazing insight and offer practical ways to use his approach when teaching children and adults.

Help save Jewish History Teaching Pressures of timetabling, and lack of familiarity has often pushed the teaching of Jewish history way down the list of priorities for schools and teachers. In this presentation, we will argue that re-introducing Jewish history into your work will both improve the overall quality of Jewish learning and engagement, as well as better prepare students for engaging with the wider world.
